## Fagowee of the Month! April 2017



#### <u>Bethany Eudy</u> shared her <u>post</u> to the group: <u>CLE for shelli</u>. <u>September 21, 2016</u>.

I am so grateful to have found this group, and to know more about Shelli... Who she is, where she came from, how she is doing, and especially knowing that she is surrounded by so much love and support. Until a few minutes ago, I only knew Shelli as the woman I met on the highway on Sunday afternoon. Her face hasn't left my thoughts for long since then. I have prayed for her constantly, hoped for her full and speedy recovery, wondered how she was doing... I was in one of the first vehicles to arrive at the accident scene after it happened. I'm a veterinarian... And a young one at that; I'm not a "human doctor," I have very little experience with serious trauma, and had no equipment or supplies with me of any kind, not even a first aid kit. But I could tell that someone was badly hurt and that help was a long way away. We were at least 20 minutes drive from Kalispell Regional Medical Center. And I knew I had to try to help this woman, in whatever limited way I could, which turned out to be hardly more than offering her my hands to hold until help arrived. But at least I was able to give her that. Here's my story about the accident, posted to my Facebook account yesterday before I knew anything about Shelli's identity or current condition. Be cautioned before reading that my description of the scene is fairly graphic. I hope someday I can meet Shelli and hug her, and see her smile. That would mean the world to me. ## **Bethany Eudy**

Sunday afternoon I had an experience that I won't soon forget. It was a moment that gives you a total change in perspective, and reminds you just how fragile our lives can be. We were driving back from Glacier Park, on hwy 2, between west glacier and Columbia falls. Suddenly we noticed that traffic was stopping up ahead... And only about 6 or 7 cars ahead of us was the source of the traffic stop. A person was laying in the road. There were no emergency vehicles anywhere to be seen. It looked like the person was just laving there limp, curled up on their side on the payement, not moving, and a few people were standing around them and bending over to look at them, but no one seemed to be "doing" much. So I told my mom to pull the car up there and I jumped out, said I'm not a doctor but I am a veterinarian, what happened? And then I could see what had happened. She was a bicyclist and she had been hit by a car. The car was going 65 mph, highway speed, and hit her without slowing down. At all. She had a huge open gash on her calf, that was the first wound I saw, and then I approached her head and saw that she was bleeding profusely from her nose with each breath she took, spraying bright red blood all over the pavement. She was unconscious. Her eyes were rolled back in her head. She was limp and non-responsive. But breathing. Breathing regularly and strongly and with clear lung sounds. There were two nurses on scene, but none had ER training or any gloves or equipment of any kind. They said Alert had been called, but was down; they were trying to get the copter back up in the air ASAP but at the moment it was unavailable. So we were waiting for an ambulance that took a year to arrive. Actually 10-15 minutes. But it felt like ages. I knelt by her head, right in front of her face so that if she opened her eves she would see that she wasn't alone. I held both of her blood-spattered hands the whole time. I talked to her constantly, told her to keep breathing, told her we were right here with her and wouldn't leave her no matter what, told her not to try to move, just try to lay still and focus on breathing, that help was on the way. I told her to squeeze my hands if she needed to, just focus on me talking to you and focus on squeezing my hands. She started to come back to consciousness after about the first 4 or 5 minutes, and she started trying to move her legs and arms, and moaning but wasn't able to speak. By the time I'd been there for 10 minutes she was definitely conscious, but couldn't say more than a few words (it hurts; that was most of what she said). Finally when the ambulance arrived she was awake and alert enough to tell them that it hurts really bad, I don't feel good, please help me, but she still hadn't given us her name. When they were cutting her clothes off and getting her on the backboard they took her helmet off, and her ears were full of blood. I couldn't tell if it was coming from her ears or from somewhere else on her head and just pooling there, but either way it wasn't good. She obviously had severe head trauma; she was in shock, and her skin was ashen and grey and clammy; she screamed when they moved her legs, they think she may have had a broken femur in addition to the laceration on her calf. And possibly internal injuries as well... she said she hurt "in the middle" and that made them think maybe she meant her belly. Anyway the worst part was that first 10 minutes, when no one was there and I just had to try to convince her to lay still and keep breathing and that help was on the way, and there wasn't anything else I could really do to help her. When EMS first arrived they had me stay at her head and keep talking to her and holding her hands while they got the neck brace on, bandaged the laceration on her calf, and took her vital signs. And then when EMS finally took over, I stood up (I had been kneeling by her head holding both her hands for close to 20 minutes at that point) and I suddenly felt super hot and light headed, I thought I was going to pass out. I was holding one corner of an emergency blanket we were using to shield her from view of onlookers, and my mom jumped out of the car and held my corner of the blanket for a minute while I sat down. She said I had turned completely white. I believe it, I thought I was going to pass out and they were going to have a second patient to deal with. But after a minute or so I went back up there and sent mom back to the car. And I stayed until they got her in the ambulance. I had her blood all over my hands, so after they got her off to the hospital the EMS crew rinsed my hands off with hydrogen peroxide. My mom and I had to tell what we saw and did, probably a dozen times, and they had our car parked between the accident scene and the line of cars so they asked us not to move while they took pictures and wrote up their reports and so forth. The bicycle she was riding was destroyed. Her stuff was scattered around the highway. The car that hit her was badly dented on the hood, the side mirror was gone, and the wind shield was shattered. The boys asked me (in a very curious, not at all upset tone of voice) if I saw a lot of blood, if the lady was dead, and where was she hurt, and how long do we have to sit here because I'm hungry. So they don't seem traumatized by the experience. But I am. I could never. EVER. Do human medicine. I have never once worried half as much for the life of one of my animal patients as I was worried for the life of this woman that I didn't even know. I was so scared that she was going to die, right there in front of me while I was holding her hands. And I still am scared that she might not have made it through. It's one of the most traumatic experiences I've ever had. I've never been so grateful to be able to just go home and eat dinner and have a normal evening, meanwhile that lady might never go home again. I tried to contact the hospital for an update, but they can't give out any information about her (of course). So I'm going over there tomorrow, and I'll wander around with flowers for her until I find someone that will tell me who she is, or at least find a way to get her the flowers. If she even made it this long. Hug your loved ones extra tight today; tomorrow is never guaranteed. 😥

The date is September 18<sup>th</sup> 2016. Shelli Snyder is in northwest Montana, while on her bike, she gets hit by a car doing 65 plus miles per hour.

She is down on the road – alone, then steps into the picture, is a young woman and these are some of her words. About that day and the next.

I knelt by her so that if she opened her eyes she would see that she wasn't alone. I held her hands the whole time. I talked to her constantly, told her we were right here with her and would 't leave her, no matter what... the worst part was that first 10 minutes.... The bicycle she was riding was destroyed ... the hospital can't give out any information about her.... I'm going over there tomorrow and I'll wander around with flowers for her until I find someone that will tell me who she is ...... Shelli Snyder, I now have a name... I am so grateful to know who she is."

Bethany Eudy filled in the missing time, held Shelli hands, told us Shelli's story in the <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hour right after her accident and the next day.

So, for being there, taking the extra steps to connect with Shelli the next day. And finding her. Writing about the accident.

I present to you now, our 2017 Fagowee of the year - Mike Gumbish. Congratulations!!!






### **ROOKIE OF THE YEAR**
